Japan Week

We have had a fantastic week learning all about Japan. Across the school we have learnt about the geography of the country, the culture, learnt some of the spoken and written language. There has been lots of Japanese food tasting and cooking going on as well.

Beech class have learnt to say Hallo and Goodbye; have tasted sushi; have made finger painting cherry blossom trees and compared London to Tokyo; finding out about similarities and differences; on top of this they have learnt a traditional Japanese folk dance.

Maple class have learnt the Japanese dance of Tanko Boshi Bon Odori; have learnt how to multiply like Japanese children; have used printing to create cherry blossom trees and made Japanese lanterns; as well as learning about Mount Fuji and building erupting volcanoes!

Elder class have learnt about the physical geography of Japan; designed and drawn their own Pokemon ball designs; practiced Kanji writing to create Easter cards for our friends in Japan and made Botamochi a traditional Japanese dish eaten during the spring Equinox.

Why not ask your child about their learning and get them to teach you some Japanese words perhaps!

We have practised our DT skills in using a hot glue gun and making an Obon Lantern, which helped us learn about the festival of Obon. We have practised a Japanese dance and had the opportunity to share this with other classes!

Elder Class

During February in Geography we have learnt about human geography and capital cities worldwide before looking at the UK motorway network and settlements. We then applied our knowledge and carried out an enquiry to identify our local settlement. We went for a walk around Bawdeswell and catalogued human features that we noticed. We could then use this evidence to explain why Bawdeswell is classified as a village and not a town or a hamlet.

In English we have studied Neil Gaiman's 'Sleeper and the Spindle'. We really enjoyed this book and we used it as a basis to write character and setting descriptions before writing our own stories.

In Art we have been photographers. We went into the woods and looked for interesting, natural patterns to photograph. We then edited our photos so they were black and white.
