Our Japanese Friends came to Visit

As part of our aim to inspire our children to discover more about the world and understand life beyond Norfolk, Reepham Primary are now in our 15th year of working in partnership with Sakado Azuma Kindergarten in the Saitama Prefecture of Japan.

For two weeks this April, our children and staff have been building on our knowledge of Japanese culture, by learning directly from Shizuka, Haroke and Natsuma. They have been in our school leading sessions on origami, writing in Kanji, katakana and hiragana, speaking basic phrases and reading Japanese children's stories. We have been treated to sampling traditional Japanese Melon Soda (which the children were most looking forwards to!). We have even all learnt a new Japanese song!







Beech Class

This month in Beech class our History learning has been all about the Victorian era. We had a Victorian day where children learnt some of the routines; learnt copper print handwriting, arithmetic and reading. The children sat in rows and had to show respect to the adults who came to the classroom by standing behind their chairs.

We had a surprise visit from some ducklings. The children sat and listened to the information of how the ducklings were rescued and asked brilliant questions. They also got a chance to stroke them.

In DT, we have been learning where our food comes from and have made our own healthy salads. The children chose 3 fruits or vegetables and peeled, diced, sliced and chopped them all. The children worked safely with the equipment. We have had a lovely time in Beech Class since being back from Easter!

Maple Class

We have celebrated another busy month in Maple class. We have been writing guidebooks for looking after a cloud, we have practised using a lot of questions! We have continued to celebrate our story telling and shared stories with the class. We really enjoy this and look forward to a new story each week.

In Science, we have begun our Plant nutrition and reproduction project. We will be planting and observing plant growth in the forthcoming weeks. In History, we have begun to focus on the Romans and the building of Rome. We have learnt about the myths and the historical account. Next week we are dressing up for a shared Roman experience at Reepham Primary school. We have enjoyed our tri-golf experience and are really looking forward to more sporting

opportunities.

Elder Class

We have started a new History unit in Elder class - the Ancient Greeks! We began by placing the Ancient Greeks on a time line and comparing it to other periods we know. We worked in teams to find out about artefacts like the Minoan Bull Leaper and the Mask of Agamemnon.

We have learnt about the Minoan and the Mycenaeans civilisations and compared them to each other.

In our English lessons, we have been working on 'The Lost Thing' by Shawn Tan. We are building up to writing our own story and we have started by writing an explanation of our version of the Ministry for Lost Things and have designed our own Lost Thing.

In PSHE, we have been thinking about how to be healthy. We have been working on designing a hotel to support the Five Ways to Wellbeing which are:

- -Being connected with others
- -Being active
- -Taking notice
- -Continuing to learn
- -Having a balanced, healthy diet.

We are creating a brochure for our hotels advertising a range of facilities which help guests to be healthy and happy.

Tri-Golf Tournament

We took a group of 10 children aged year 2-4 on a Tri Gold Festival, we took part in an arrange of stations, we practiced lots of our tri golf skills such as hitting the ball to hit a target, hitting the ball into a cone and we practiced chipping the ball.
