We have been exploring place value, addition and subtraction with numbers up to four digits in Maths.

In English, we loved reading The Tin Forest by Helen Ward. Inspired by the story, we created fabulous leaflets all about protecting the environment, focusing on Pensthorpe. Cedar Class

This half term, Cedar Class has learned so much about trees as part of our Enchanted Woodland topic! We had lots of fun outside looking at trees, collecting 'treasures', carrying out science experiments and creating art projects. We particularly enjoyed measuring trees, making nature art and birdwatching.

Our stories in English also connected to woodlands. The children wrote some fantastic stories based on Billy and the Beast, some beautiful poems about a house 'held up by trees' and they have just finished their information booklets full of facts about the wonder of trees.

In maths, the children have made so much progress in understanding number and carrying out calculations. They have learned how to use counters, base ten and number lines to carry out addition and subtraction questions. They also used their place value knowledge to compare and order numbers, and to solve missing number problems.

We also had lots of fun this half term in our music lessons learning songs and challenged our fitness in levels in our PE and games activities. Our Foxley Trip on Wednesday was just a perfect way to round up our work this half term!

Cedar Class Go Wild!

The Year 1 and 2 children had a memorable school trip to Foxley Wood, blending classroom learning with hands-on experiences in an ancient woodland. The activities and games that children took part in were led by the friendly and knowledgeable Rangers of the Norfolk Wildlife Trust, and they were centred around woodland habitats and exploring plants and animals that live in these environments.

Children were captivated by amazing facts about their natural surroundings and relished the experience of collecting their own acorns, which they later used to help plant a new woodland on site. This practical involvement not only reinforced their curricular knowledge but also instilled a sense of responsibility towards nature.



The positive and fun atmosphere of the day was obvious, as the children walked around, observed nature closely and chose their own spot in a grassy meadow to plant their acorn. By the end of their adventure, Cedar Class left Foxley Woods with great memories and a deeper understanding of their local woodland habitat. What a fantastic way for children to learn!
